Dear Friends,

We continue our review of Margaret Wheatley's core principles of change. The third principle is that "We do not see 'reality'; we each create our own interpretation of what is real." One of my favorite quotes comes from Lily Tomlin's one woman show: In Search of Intelligent Life in the Universe. In that show her bag lady character says: "What is reality? Reality is nothing more than a collective hunch!" In other words, we all create our own reality. Anyone who has sat through a congregational meeting knows that what they heard and understood will be vastly different than what their neighborhood heard—the after-meeting meetings in the parking lot are proof of this.

Fitting into this principle is my own motto that perception is everything. In many ways it does not matter what really happened, or what really was said. All that matters is what people think they heard or saw. Ten spies went into the Promised Land to scout things out for the people. One came back seeing everything that God had promised and opportunities just waiting to be seized. Nine saw fearsome people, fortified cities, and a path wrought with obstacles. They were all in the same land, but one saw the possibilities while the others saw only doom. Of course the people chose to listen only to the nine, and as a result spent 40 years in the Wilderness before they could finally see the possibilities of God's promise.

If we understand that everyone has his or her own perceptions of reality, we can use that to create a stronger and more dynamic vision. If we can learn to listen to other people's perspectives, we can open ourselves to a new way of seeing and thinking. When we know that our views are heard and respected, we feel invested in the process, and can actually come to enjoy the interchange and get excited about creating something new.

Perhaps if the Children of Israel had been aware of this principle, they could have set up a process to discuss their perceptions, and maybe then they could have actually heard God's presentation of the reality God wanted to create with them. Wouldn't it be great to have our next congregational meeting be a time to share our different visions, listen respectfully to everyone, and together, with God, create a new and stronger vision that connects all our realities together? It would be a lot better than screaming so loudly to be heard that we can't hear anyone else, wouldn't it?

Understanding this principle can help us to create a healthier Zion. It can also help us to understand our neighbors during this time of heated political discord. How can that person even think of supporting that candidate? Because their reality is different from ours. When we recognize that, maybe we can begin to work together again as a country and create a new reality that works or the greater good of all. We can dream, can't we?


